These estimates represent the number of otherwise uninsured children in each state who could be covered over the next five years under the Children's Health Insurance Program Reauthorization Act of 2007 (CHIPRA). They are based on CBO estimates of the total number of children who could be covered under the bill. Families USA distributed the CBO's national estimate (3.8 million children) across the 50 states and DC based upon the proportion of children that are uninsured and the proportions of children enrolled in Medicaid and CHIP in each state.
