
Key Takeaways


- 1. Voters put a high priority on congressional action to address high drug prices, and there is overwhelming support for legislation to give Medicare the power to negotiate with drug companies for lower prices.
- 2. Large majorities of voters believe that drug companies charge unreasonably high amounts for medicine and that most Americans face difficulties in affording the costs of prescriptions.
- 3. Even if the high cost of prescriptions does not affect them personally, voters believe that it is a challenge for other Americans.
- There is overwhelming support across party lines for legislation that would cap the price on any COVID-19 vaccines or treatment developed with federal funding.







Characteristics of Survey Respondents






- Online survey with 1,203 registered voters nationwide

- Included moment-to-moment dial tests for six Families USA videos and one PhRMA video












Voters' three most urgent priorities for Congress center on healthcare.









While overall feelings toward drug companies are mixed, there's widespread agreement that companies charge too much for prescription drugs.

Assessment of Amount Pharmaceutical Companies Charge for Rx Drugs








COVID-19 VACCINE






There is strong and bipartisan consensus that Congress has a responsibility to make sure that a treatment or vaccine for COVID-19 is both affordable and widely available.

- It is federal gov't responsibility to make sure enough coronavirus vaccine is produced so everyone in U.S can get one
- Decisions about production of a vaccine should be left up to PhRMA company that developed it


