Dear Sen. Bennet, Sen. Cortez Masto, Sen. Hassan, Sen. Kelly, and Sen. Warnock,

Thank you for your leadership on lowering the cost of prescription drugs. As organizations representing consumers, patients, children, seniors, workers, businesses, and others, we are grateful to each of you for filing on the U.S. Senate floor a declarative amendment establishing support for comprehensive Medicare negotiation as a part of the upcoming reconciliation package.

As you know, America's families are looking to Congress to enact major health reforms that will finally alleviate the immense financial burden that prescription drug costs cruelly level on everyday people. Across our nation, a disturbingly high percentage of people face the impossible choice of foregoing or rationing medications so they can afford other basic needs. This pattern is consistent year over year, with an average of 29% of people across the country forced to make this choice in a given year.¹

It is time to put an end to the outrageous price of drugs and the solution is clear: Mandating strong and comprehensive Medicare negotiation that saves taxpayer dollars and prevents pharmaceutical industry executives from recklessly increasing drug prices with impunity. In order to fully address the damage caused to the American people by out of control drug prices, we also need to extend the gains from Medicare negotiation to people who purchase their health insurance through their employer or in the non-group market.

Last week's Senate passage of the FY2022 Budget Resolution with reconciliation instructions signals remarkable promise in making significant drug pricing reforms and, critically, your amendment highlights the importance of enacting Medicare negotiation that will improve the lives of millions of Americans. Thank you for taking a bold stand on this issue.
